## COVID-19 UPDATE

There have been no new cases of COVID-19 today. There have been a total of 447 cases reported in SA.

There are two active cases in SA and 441 people have been cleared of COVID-19. There have been four reported deaths from COVID-19. More than 207,500 tests have been undertaken.

From 00:01am, Wednesday 29 July 2020, SA residents will no longer be able to return to SA from Victoria. Only essential travellers will be able to enter SA from Victoria.

There is a significantly higher risk of COVID-19 due to current outbreaks interstate. If you have any symptoms of COVID-19, no matter how mild, you need to get tested as soon as possible.

If you know someone with symptoms of COVID-19, encourage them to seek testing. Once you get a test, return home immediately and wait for your results. If you receive a negative test result, you should still stay at home and not attend work, school or childcare until you are feeling well again.

Do not go to public places if you are unwell – this includes work, education, childcare, shopping centres, sporting events, social or religious gatherings.

Everyone must continue to follow measures that will help stop the spread. Practice good hygiene, keep 1.5 metres distance from others and stay at home if you are unwell.

People experiencing any of the following symptoms should be tested for COVID-19:

- Fever or chills (in the absence of an alternative illness that explains these symptoms)
- An acute respiratory infection e.g. symptoms of cough, sore throat, runny nose, or shortness of breath
- Loss of smell or alteration in the sense of taste
