### Stop the Spread campaign

This week SA Health launched the next phase of the [Stop the Spread campaign](#).

This encourages the community to continue following health advice to stop the spread of COVID-19 in South Australia.



### COVID-19 Queensland health alert

SA Health is calling on all travellers returning to South Australia from the greater Brisbane and Ipswich areas to closely monitor their health for COVID-19 symptoms. Anyone who develops symptoms, no matter how mild, should be [tested](#) for COVID-19.

Anyone in South Australia who visited any of the [venues posted](#) by Queensland Health during the dates and times listed is requested to self-isolate for 14 days from the date they attended the venue.

### Expansion of State Control Centre - Health

The State Control Centre - Health (SCC-H) will be expanded to ensure South Australia is equipped to tackle the long term challenges of COVID-19.

The SCC-H will be relocated into a larger, dedicated area within SA Health headquarters and up to an additional 40 staff will join the team to support the state's response to the pandemic.

### **New COVID-19 case (Sunday 23 August)**

A nurse who has returned from Victoria has tested positive to COVID-19. She has been in quarantine since her arrival.
