

New COVID-19 Restrictions in South Australia

Due to the concerning increase of COVID-19 cases in Victoria and following a number of recent cases in South Australia, Premier Steven Marshall has announced new restrictions to help prevent the spread of the coronavirus in South Australia.

From midnight on Tuesday 4th August 2020:

- **Gatherings held at private homes will be reduced from a maximum of 50 people down to a maximum of 10 people**
- **Licensed venues such as bars, pubs, and restaurants will only be allowed to serve alcohol to patrons who are seated**
- **Weddings and Funerals will continue to have a maximum number of 100 people with contact tracing required**

New restrictions in SA

Follow the limits for public gatherings (1.5m apart and 1p2sqm rules)

Don't shake hands, hug, or kiss anyone who lives outside of your household

Download the COVID Safe App

Understand the rules of isolation

Get tested if you have symptoms (even mild) or have been exposed to a potentially infected close contact
