## Mask advice

At this time in South Australia it is not mandatory for the general community, but it is recommended to wear a mask when out in public if you are unable to keep 1.5 metres away from other people.

This means wearing a mask whenever you're at a shopping centre, grocery store, hospital, health or aged care site and when using public transportation.

Children under 12 years of age do not need to wear a mask, as they may not be able to handle it safely.
