

COVID-19 UPDATE 387: FRIDAY 19 NOVEMBER 2021

EntryCheck SA

[EntryCheck SA](#) is the new entry process to protect South Australia and minimise the impact of COVID-19 as our borders open.

From 23 November 2021, all people planning to travel to South Australia from interstate and overseas, including returning South Australians, must apply through EntryCheck SA.

EntryCheck SA will assess vaccination status and COVID-19 risk, and advise of any entry conditions. Depending on your level of risk, you may need to complete quarantine, testing and symptom check requirements using HealthCheck SA.

Note: EntryCheck SA will be available from 19 November 2021 for people planning to travel to South Australia after 12.01am 23 November 2021. Travellers planning to enter South Australia before 12.01am 23 November 2021 must still complete the [Cross Border Travel Registration](#) process.

HealthCheck SA

HealthCheck SA is a mobile app that guides users through their quarantine, testing and/or symptom check requirements.

Features of HealthCheck SA include:

- Quarantine schedule
- Multiple, randomised location check-ins using live face recognition
- Personalised testing schedule
- Daily symptom checks
- Health and wellbeing support and resources.

Functions available in HealthCheck SA depend on individual requirements.

The HealthCheck SA team is supported by SA Police to ensure users are compliant

with their requirements.

HealthCheck SA will also be used to manage the quarantine, testing and symptom check requirements of positive COVID-19 cases and their contacts.
