COVID-19 vaccine booster doses

COVID-19 vaccine booster doses are available to people aged 18+ years at least six months after their second dose.

Booster doses provide further protection from the effects of COVID-19, and will be free for everyone.

Booster doses will be available from:

- Monday 8 November at participating GPs, pharmacies, and Respiratory Clinics.
- Wednesday 1 December at [SA Health vaccination clinics](#).

People who are severely immunocompromised can receive a third dose of a COVID-19 vaccine 2 to 6 months after receiving a second dose. Read more about [eligibility conditions](#) and speak to your GP.

Walk-in COVID-19 vaccine clinic - 2021 Multicultural Festival

Trained medical professionals will be available to answer questions and help community members to receive the COVID-19 vaccine in a safe and

comfortable environment.

- Renmark High School

Schools will be open again on Saturday 4 December to deliver second doses.

COVID-19 vaccination for youth

All children aged 12 and over can get the Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

The Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine is available at:

- SA Health vaccination clinics

- Selected GPs
- Selected Respiratory Clinics
- Selected metropolitan and regional schools

The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is available at:

- Selected pharmacies

For children being vaccinated at school, parents/caregivers will need to sign a consent card and return it to the school but do not need to attend. Outside school, parents/caregivers of children aged 12-15 years need to provide consent for vaccination and attend the appointment.
