SA exposure locations

SA Health has identified new exposure locations in South Australia associated with positive cases of COVID-19. Action is required by the community.

COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits

The use of over-the-counter COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits is currently prohibited in South Australia. These tests are much more likely to miss cases of COVID-19 than oral and nasal swab PCR testing, particularly when there are low levels of COVID-19 in the community.

Use of RAT in South Australia will be introduced when there is spread of COVID-19 in the community. At all times, people with symptoms, even if mild, need to get a PCR test at a pathology site, not use a RAT.

COVID-19 case update

There have been eighteen new cases of COVID-19 reported today. Today's cases are eight males between the ages of 30 and 60 years old and ten females in their fifties. 16 cases acquired their infection locally, while two cases acquired their infection interstate.
