### **Rapid antigen test collection points in Ceduna and Streaky Bay**

New rapid antigen test (RAT) collection points opened today in Ceduna and Streaky Bay.

If you are a close contact, you can register online to access a RAT kit from the collection points. Each RAT kit contains two free rapid antigen tests.

### **Novavax COVID-19 vaccine approved by TGA**

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) has granted provisional approval for the Novavax COVID-19 vaccine in Australia.

The protein-based vaccine has been approved for 18 years and older as primary two dose course, with a three-week interval between doses. The Novavax COVID-19 vaccine is provisionally approved for primary vaccination only. It has not been approved for booster doses or for children.

It is expected that supplies will be available from February onwards pending final approval from the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI). For more information, visit the [TGA website](#).
